When something runs it flows or spreads, as a spilled liquid does. Water drips from the melting ice and runs down the side of the house.

sugar

Sugar is something sweet that is made from the juice of plants. People add sugar to food to make it taste sweet.

syrup

Syrup is a thick, sweet liquid.

Jordan poured syrup on his pancakes.

tack12

Tack means to hang something up using a small nail.

tap¹

Tap means to make a hole in something so you can get the liquid out.

I smile when I see a puppy playing with a ball.


A Pug

Land is ground that is not under water.


Our house is on land that is next to a river.


climb²³

pen¹


A pen is a place with a fence around it to keep animals.

Your house is a place where you spend a lot of time.



fins¹


Fins are flat, wing-shaped body parts that stick out of many fish and some other animals.



Fish use their fins to help them move through the water.


swim¹

If something is fake, it is pretend or not real.


You cannot buy anything with fake money.

A shell is the hard cover on some things, like eggs, turtles, and submarines.




ship¹

fences²²


Fences are structures that are put around an area to control who can go in or out of the area.
