
Amazing means great, special, or surprising. *The amazing little dog swam all the way across the lake*.

fabric²³


Fabric is cloth. It can be used to make clothes, curtains, and other goods. *To make a winter coat, Marcie cut out and sewed some thick fabric.*

imagination

Imagination is the ability to think of pictures and ideas in your mind. *My brother has a good imagination; he always tells stories about dragons.*

In time means later or after a while. Li was happy when summer vacation started, but in time, she started to miss her friends from school.

special

Special means different from the rest. All the pillows on my bed were white except for the special purple pillow Mom sewed for me.

tar

Tar is liquid that gets hard and is used to make roads.

Wetsuits are special types of clothing worn to keep warm in cold water.




Jackfruit



sense


A sense is a way that the body can get information from the world around it. *My sense of sight got much better when I put on my new glasses.*

claim


When you claim something, you take it and say it is yours. *Maddie will claim her prize at the end of the day*.

Figures are shapes, forms, or outlines. We could see figures in the clouds that looked like bears.

human²⁰

Human means having to do with a person or people.

modern

Modern means new, up-to-date, and in the present day. *The new school will be more modern—it will have more computers and a pool.*

protect²

Protect means to keep something safe. When I ride my skateboard, I wear a helmet and wrist guards to protect my head and wrists.

scientists²²

Scientists are people who study things using tests and experiments. *Some scientists watch and study animals; some scientists study the weather.*

treasure

A treasure is something that is special, valuable, or precious. *The boy thought the arrowhead he found was a treasure.*

treasured

Treasured means special, valuable, or precious. *My mom keeps her treasured necklace in a safe place.*

hit

In baseball, hit means to get to a base safely after hitting the ball with a bat. *Juan hit two home runs in the baseball game*.

home runs

hospital

A hospital is a place where doctors and nurses take care of people who are sick or hurt. *When my father cut his hand, we took him to the hospital.*



orphanage

An orphanage is a home for children who do not have parents or for children whose parents cannot take care of them.

record

A record is information used to keep track of something.

reminded

Reminded means made someone think about something from the past. *The pink dress reminded the old woman of when she was a child; she used to have one just like it.*

An ax is a tool with a handle and a sharp blade that is used to cut down trees.

A character is a person or animal in a story. *Charlotte the spider is my favorite character in the book* Charlotte's Web.

imaginary²¹

Imaginary means made up or not real. Unicorns are imaginary; you will not see them in real life.

loggers

Loggers are people whose job is to cut down trees.



0X²⁸

An ox is a large animal often used to pull or carry heavy things.



picked²⁵

Picked means poked or scraped in order to remove small pieces from something.

prized

Prized means thought of as important or special. *They prized their garden; they loved the fresh flowers it gave them.*

qualities

Qualities are specific features or traits that make a thing what it is. *Two qualities of gum are that it is sticky and that it is stretchy*.

tall tales²

Tall tales are made-up stories that are told as if they are true. In tall tales, things are bigger, better, or worse than they are in real life. *Grandpa liked to tell tall tales, like the story about the time he caught a fish as big as his boat.*


Dragons are pretend monsters that look like big lizards and breathe fire.

trained

Trained means worked hard to become good at something. *Maria trained for many months, and now she is a great tennis player.*

voted

Voted means chosen for something by a group of people. *She was voted class president by her classmates.*

Mammoth Site

died out

If a kind of animal or plant has died out, all of that kind have died and none of that kind are living anymore. *Dinosaurs died out long ago; they have not been alive for millions of years*.

extinct²⁰

If a kind of animal or plant is extinct, all of that kind have died and none of that kind are living anymore. *Dinosaurs became extinct long ago; no dinosaurs have been alive for millions of years.*

fossils

Fossils are what is left of plants and animals that have been dead a very long time. *The museum has fossils of plants that lived millions of years ago.*



ice-age

Ice-age means a time very long ago when the earth was very cold and mostly covered with sheets of ice. *Some ice-age people lived in caves to stay warm.*

mammals

Mammals are warmblooded animals that have fur or hair and do not lay eggs. *Human beings, dogs, and cows are different kinds of mammals.*



museum

A museum is a place that has beautiful, interesting, or unusual things to look at. *We saw dinosaur bones and mummies at the museum*.



sinkhole


A sinkhole is an opening in the ground. A sinkhole is often deep and filled with water.

site

A site is the place or location of something. *The square of dirt in the back yard is the site where we will plant the garden.*

tusks

Tusks are long, sharp teeth that stick out of the faces of elephants and walruses.

Uncovered means found something that was buried. *The dog uncovered a bone that was buried in the field.*

Guitars

band

A band is a group of people who play music together. *My brother is in a band that plays rock and roll music.*



chord²⁹

A chord is the sound of more than one musical note played at the same time. *Bill played a chord on the piano by pressing five keys at once.*

guitars

Guitars are musical instruments with six strings and a long neck.



key³¹

If you sing on key, you make the right musical sound. *The choir sounded nice when they sang on key.*

metal²³

Metal is a material like gold, silver, copper, or iron. *She decided to wear a silver ring because silver is her favorite metal.*

note

A note is a musical sound or tone. *Betsy* played a high note on her flute, and *Keith played a low note on his tuba*.

nylon

Nylon is a strong material used to make many things. *Fishing lines, guitar strings, and stockings are often made of nylon.*

pick

A pick is a small piece of plastic that is sometimes used to play the guitar. *The guitar strings made Eli's fingers sore, so he played using a pick instead.*



plucks

A person plucks the string of an instrument by pulling it and then quickly letting go.

strings²²

Strings are thin metal or nylon wires. *Guitars and violins have strings*.



strums

A person strums an instrument by moving the fingers or a pick lightly over the strings.

The Flute

ancient

Ancient means very old. *He found an ancient coin; it was over 2,000 years old.*

bands

Bands are groups of people who make music together. *Bands often have saxophones, trumpets, and drums.*



finger holes

Finger holes are small openings on an instrument. People cover the finger holes to change the instrument's sound. *When Hazel uncovered the finger holes, the flute played a different sound.*

instrument

An instrument makes music. *A piano is an instrument*.

keys

Keys are the parts of instruments you press down to make music.



metal

Metal is a material like gold, silver, copper, or iron. *She decided to wear a silver ring because silver is her favorite metal.*

mouthpiece

A mouthpiece is the part of an instrument you put your mouth near or on to make music.



notes

Notes are musical sounds or tones. Betsy played high notes on her flute.

orchestras

Orchestras are groups of people who make music together by playing instruments. *Violins, flutes, and cellos are some instruments played in orchestras.*



reeds

Reeds are tall plants that grow in or near water.



solo

Solo means alone or without other instruments. *Luisa played solo; she was the only person making music.*

tubes

Tubes are long, round shapes that are empty in the middle. *Garden hoses and drinking straws are two kinds of tubes.*

Pelé

championship

A championship is a game or sports contest to decide who will win first place. *The track team got a trophy for winning the championship.*

Hall of Fame³

A Hall of Fame is a group of people who are the very best at something. *Michael Jordan was a great basketball player and is now in the Basketball Hall of Fame.*

lost his mind

We might ask if someone has lost his mind when we think the person is doing something strange.

low-scoring

Low-scoring means players do not get very many points. *The low-scoring hockey game ended in a 1–1 tie.*

national team

A national team is a group of some of the best players from one country in a sport. *Spain's national team was the winner of the 2010 World Cup.*

New York Cosmos³

The New York Cosmos were a professional soccer team for New York City from 1971 to 1985.

pro

If you are a pro, or professional sports player, you are very good at that sport and get paid to play it.

professional

A professional player is a person who plays a sport for money.

Santos

Santos is a soccer team from the city of Santos, Brazil.

soccer

Soccer is a game played on grass by people who try to kick a ball into the other team's goal.



sock²³ A sock is a cloth you wear on your foot.




World Cup²

brain

complex

Complex means hard to understand; not simple. When I took apart the watch and saw all the parts, I knew it was too complex for me to fix.

controls¹⁴

Controls means directs or is in charge of someone or something. *She controls her dog by telling him what to do and giving him a treat when he does it.*

heartbeat

A heartbeat is the action of a heart sending blood through the body. *After Betty ran a mile, her heartbeat was faster than usual.*

human¹⁶

A human is a person.



signals

Signals tell you what is going on around you. *Fire alarms and smoke are signals that there is a fire.*

Cuckoo Birds

call

A call is a special sound an animal makes. *A howl is the call of a coyote*.

chicks

Chicks are baby birds. Bluebird chicks are not blue at first; they get their blue feathers as they grow into adult birds.



cuckoo

Cuckoo means crazy or strange. *The kids thought the clown was cuckoo.*

foster parents²

Foster parents take care of babies that are not their own.

hatch

Hatch means to be born from an egg.



lays

Lays means makes eggs come out of the body. *The bird lays its eggs in the nest.*

sit²²

Sit means to keep eggs warm by covering them with the body until they hatch.

strange

If something is strange, it is different from what you are used to seeing. Wilma thought the man looked strange because he was wearing a heavy jacket on the hottest day of summer.

Meat-Eating Plant

flytrap

A flytrap is a plant that catches insects for food and eats them.



fold

Fold means to bring two sides of something together. *I had to fold the letter so that it would fit into the envelope*.

hairs

Hairs are thin growths on the skin of people, animals, and some plants. *You can see the hairs on your head, arms, and legs.*

insects

Insects are small animals with six legs. Insects often have wings. *Flies and beetles are insects*.



inside

The inside of something is the part that faces in or faces the center. *Mya wrote her name on the inside of her lunch bag, so people could not see her name unless they opened the bag.*

lock

Lock means to shut in or out. When I lock the car, nobody can open its doors.

pressure

Pressure is force or weight that is put on something. When I studied outside, I put a heavy book on my papers so the pressure would keep them from flying away in the wind.

spines

Spines are hard, sharp points that grow on some plants and animals. *The quills on a porcupine are spines*.



trap

A trap is something that catches animals and keeps them from getting away. *Andrea set a trap for the mouse; after she caught the mouse, it could not run around Andrea's house anymore.*

The Gentle Shark

bristles

Bristles are short, thin pieces that poke out of something.

diver

A diver is a person who wears special gear to swim down into deep ocean water.



gentle²⁰

Gentle means mild or not likely to cause harm. *Her dog is gentle; it likes to curl up next to people, and it never bites.*

gills²⁷

Gills are body parts that help an animal breathe under water.



plankton²

Plankton are very small plants and animals that whales and bigger fish eat.



search²³

A search is a careful check in order to find something.

swallow

Swallow means to make something go through the mouth and into the stomach. *People usually chew their food before they swallow it.*

tons²²

If an animal weighs tons, it weighs many thousands of pounds. *If something weighs two tons, it weighs 4,000 pounds.*

trap²⁵

Trap means to catch and hold or stop from getting out or away. *She will trap the cool air in the room by closing all the windows and doors.*
