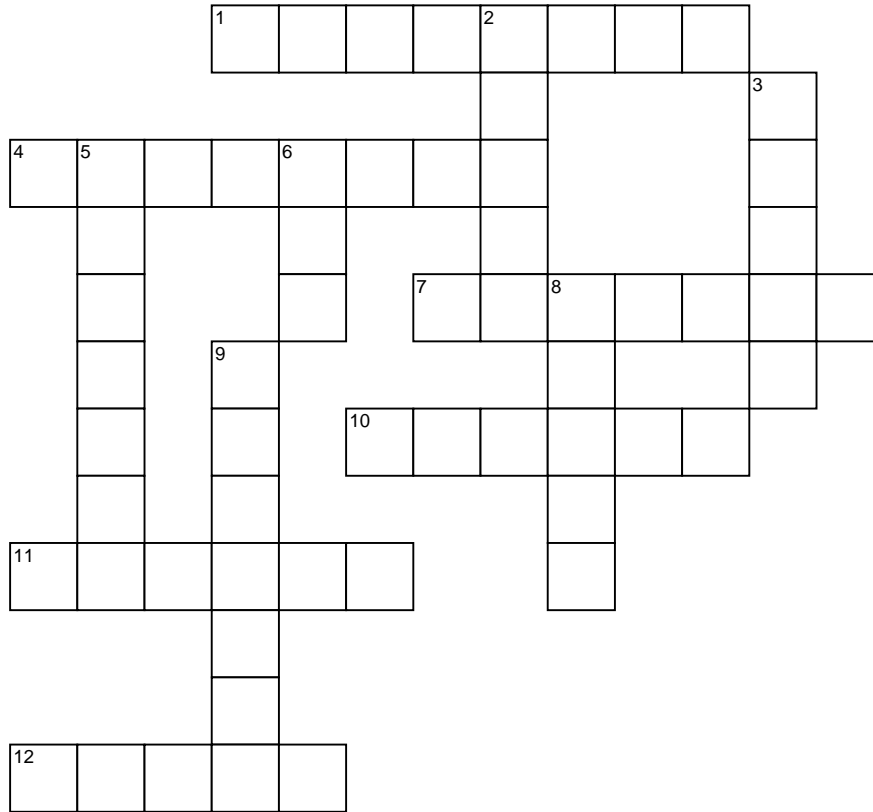

- 12 not connected or attached well

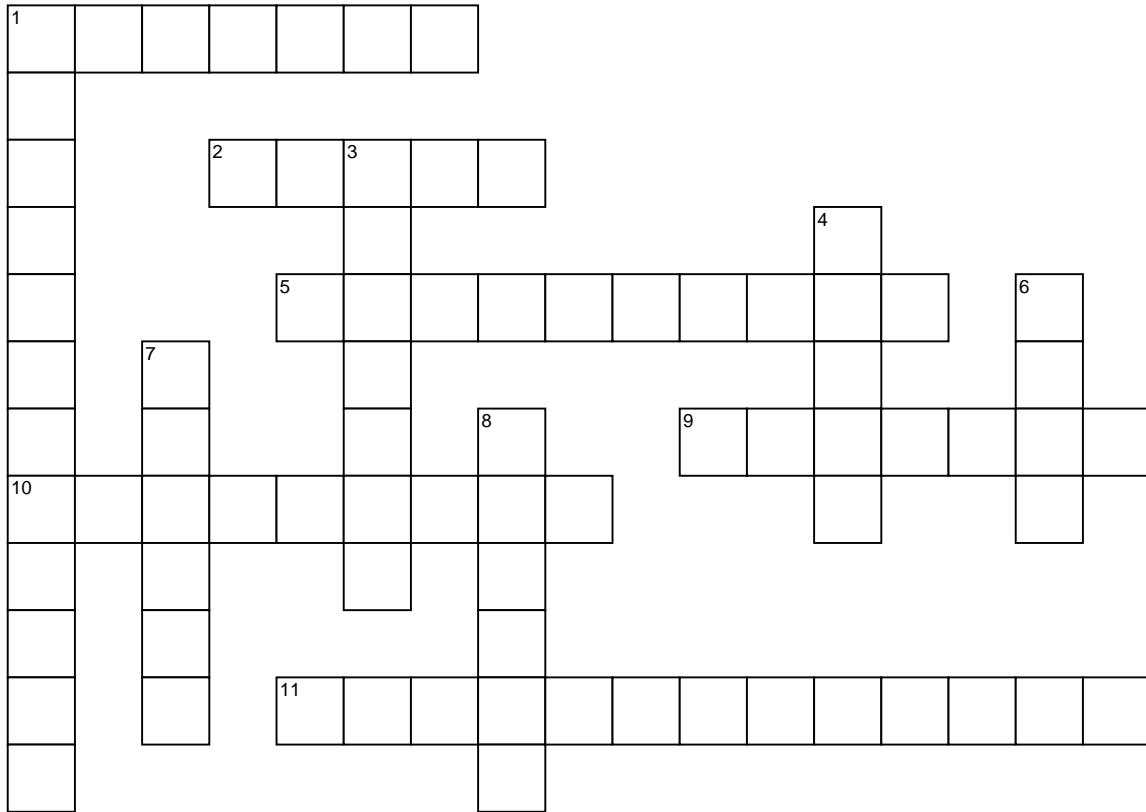
DOWN

- 12** just or only

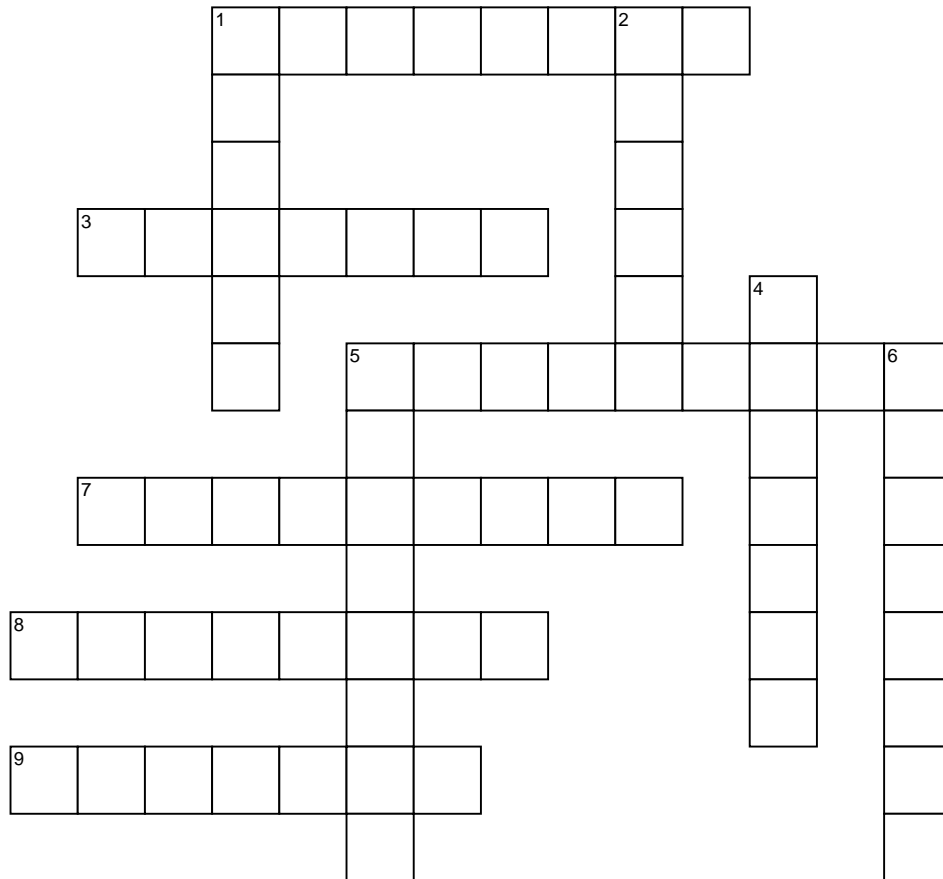
DOWN

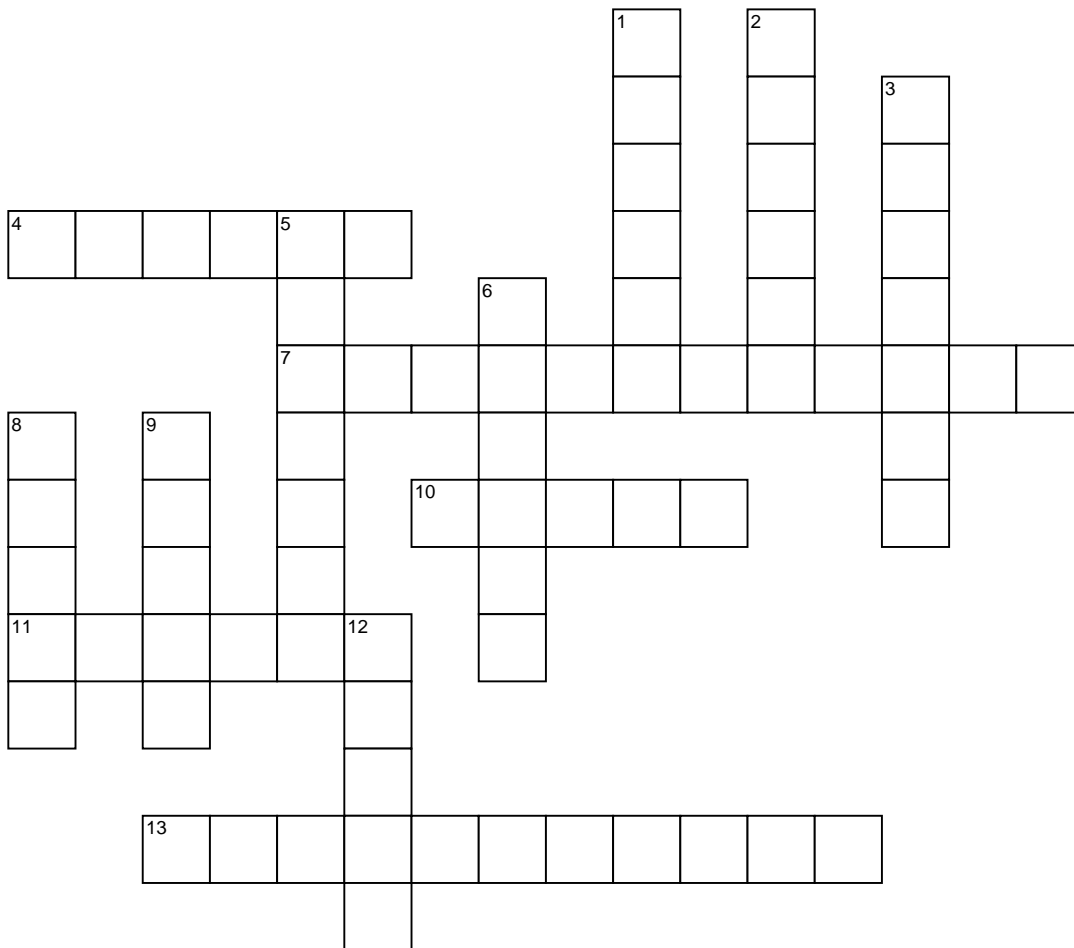

- 13** facts that you can learn or things you can know

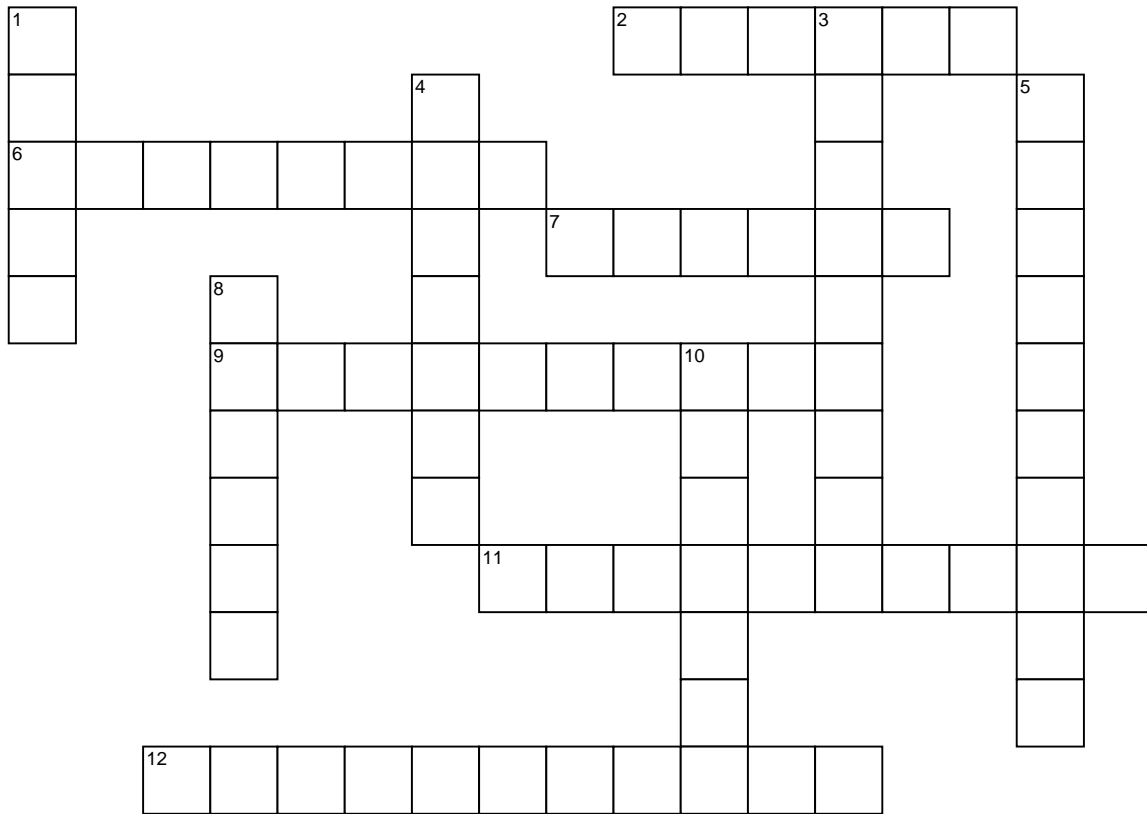
DOWN

- 12 right away or very soon

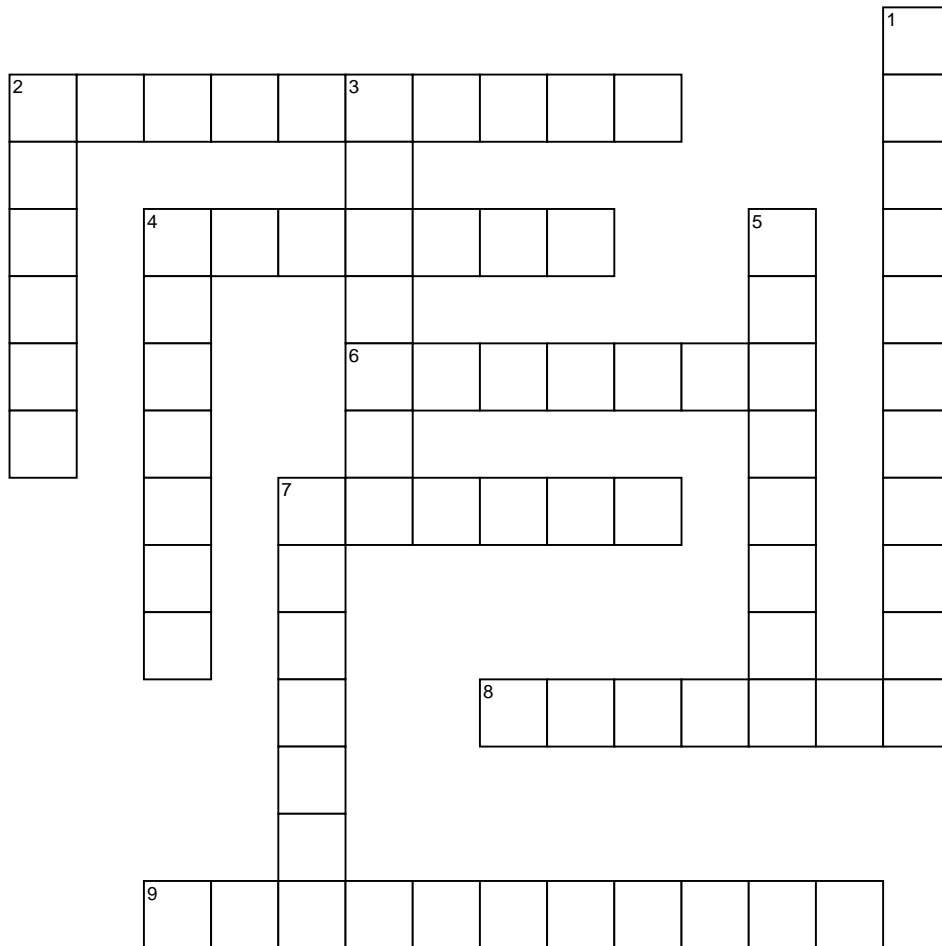
DOWN

- 9 luckily or because of good fortune

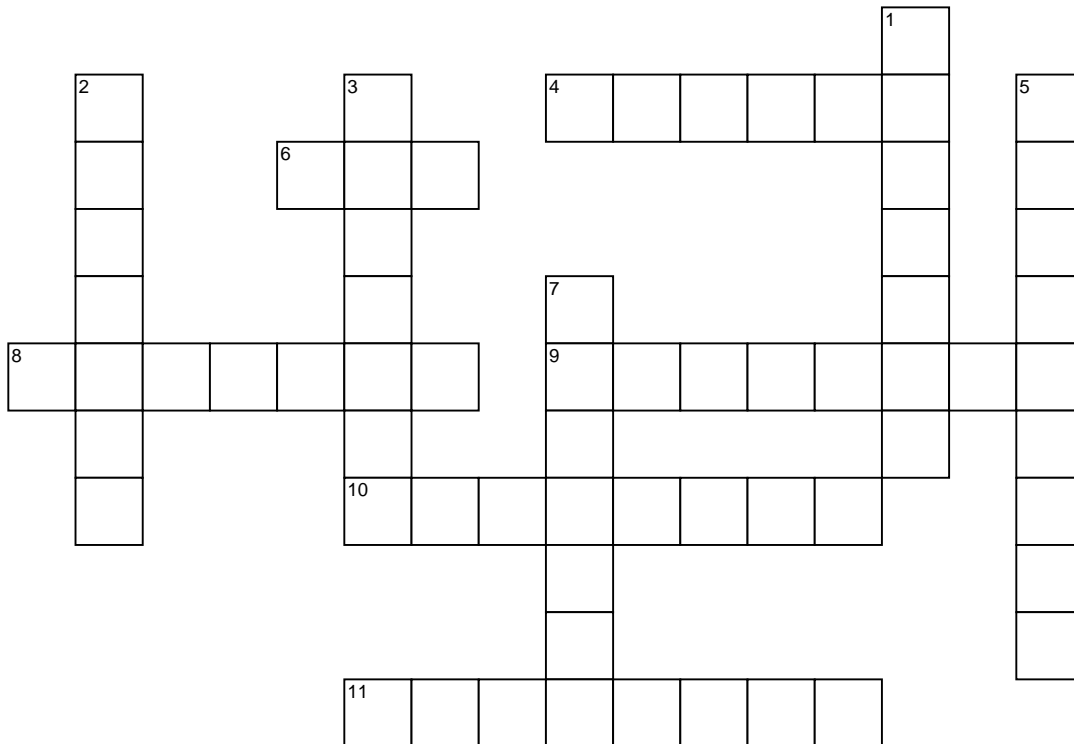
DOWN

- 11** trying to learn about something

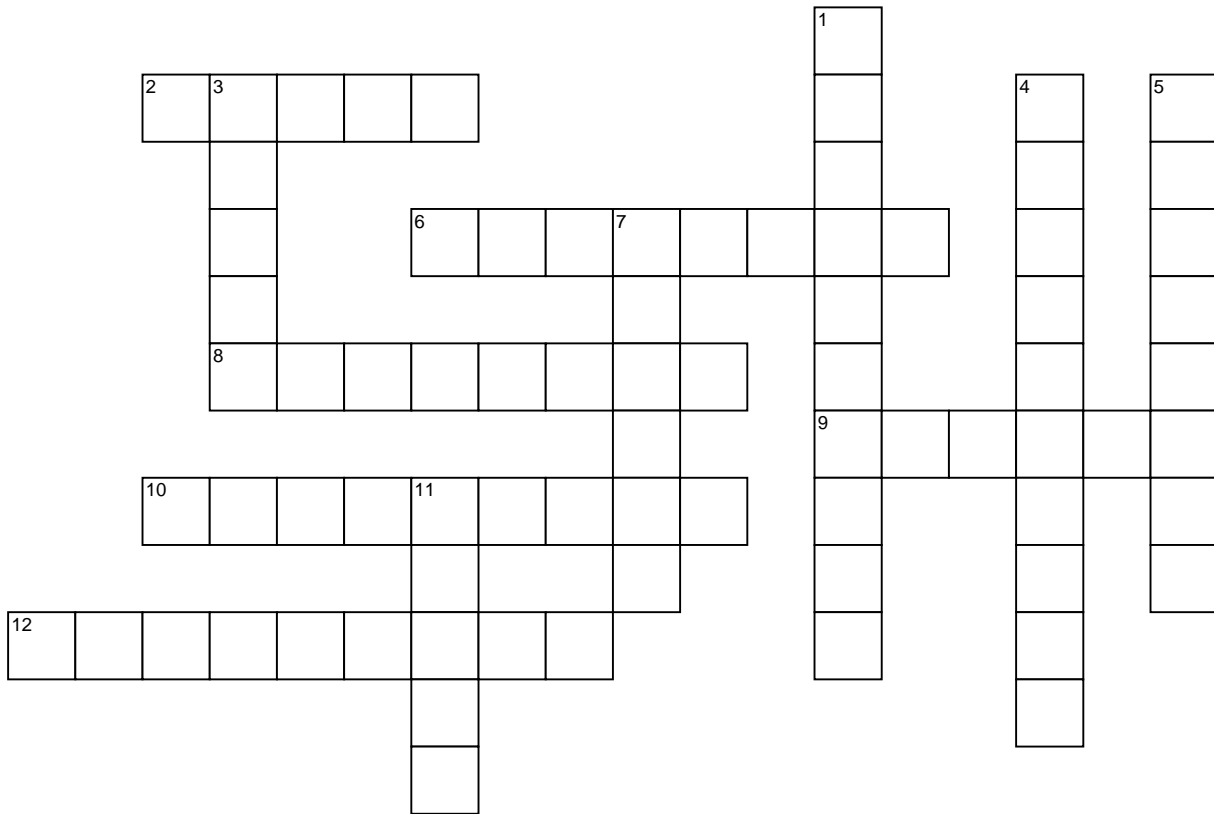
DOWN
