

## Learn New Words

### charming<sup>12</sup>

Charming means pleasant, nice, and attractive. *It was easy to like Tom because he was so charming.*

### coffee shop<sup>13</sup>

A coffee shop is a small restaurant where people buy coffee and other drinks and snacks. *I like to go to the coffee shop and have a hot drink while I read the newspaper.*

### couple<sup>14</sup>

A couple is a small number of something; usually two. *Mom said I could have a couple of pieces of candy if I ate all my dinner.*

### couples<sup>15</sup>

Couples are people who do things together in groups of two; usually couples are dating. *There were six couples dancing at the New Year's party.*



### dated<sup>16</sup>

Dated means went places together, often because two people liked each other in a romantic way. *Jamal and Kelly dated for a while; they ate at restaurants and saw movies together.*

### fallen in love<sup>17</sup>

If you have fallen in love, you have started to love someone romantically. *Sherry could not believe how quickly she had fallen in love with her new boyfriend.*

### few<sup>18</sup>

A few is a small number of something. *We sold 96 boxes of cookies; we needed to sell a few more boxes to reach our goal of selling 100.*

### finally<sup>19</sup>

Finally means after a long time. *After waiting all year, I finally got to celebrate my birthday again.*

### hated<sup>20</sup>

Hated means disliked very much. *Shelly did not like the taste of nuts, so she hated when her mom put nuts in brownies.*

### love letters<sup>21</sup>

Love letters are notes that tell someone how much you care for them. *My brother writes love letters to his new girlfriend.*

### married<sup>22</sup>

Married means having a husband or wife. *My parents got married 20 years ago.*

### months<sup>23</sup>

Months are lengths of time equal to about 30 or 31 days. *A year has 12 months.*



## Learn New Words, Continued

### **romantic**<sup>24</sup>

Romantic means having to do with the love of someone you date or are married to, or someone you want to date or marry. *Brad loves his wife, so he does romantic things for her like sending her flowers.*

### **sent**<sup>25</sup>

Sent means made something go somewhere. *After my birthday, I sent thank-you notes in the mail to my friends.*

### **smart**<sup>26</sup>

Smart means clever and good at thinking. *Sam is smart and can figure out most puzzles.*

### **sweet**<sup>27</sup>

Sweet means kind and caring. *The children loved their sweet teacher because she always spent extra time talking with them after class.*

### **thoughtful**<sup>28</sup>

Thoughtful means showing care and kindness. *Tim was thoughtful; he often raked the leaves and shoveled the snow off the sidewalk for the older lady that lived near him.*

### **thrilled**<sup>29</sup>

Thrilled means very happy and excited. *She was thrilled when she got a new pony for her birthday.*

### **together**<sup>30</sup>

Together means with each other or with other people. *We worked on the puzzle together because it was too hard for one person to do alone.*

### **treated**<sup>31</sup>

Treated means acted or behaved toward someone in a certain way. *My grandma treated us well; she always gave us hugs and baked cookies for us.*
