notice³¹


Notice means to see or to observe. *Maria* wants her dance teacher to notice that she is a good dancer.

starfish

A starfish is a sea animal that is shaped like a star. It has five or more arms and lives in shallow areas of the sea.



willing²²

Willing means ready or wanting to do something. *Marni was willing to help out at the car wash because she wanted to raise money for her school.*

engine

An engine is a machine that makes things work or go. *The engine in my car is not working, so I cannot drive to work today.*



frame²⁴

A frame is a structure, like a skeleton, that something is built around so that it has a shape and support. A house's frame is often made of wooden beams.

If something happens frequently, it happens often or many times.

fuel²⁷

Gas is a short way of saying gasoline. Gasoline is a liquid fuel that is made from oil.

oil

tubular²⁶

If things are tubular, they are shaped like tubes. *Pipes are tubular*.

tuned³³

When an engine is tuned, small changes are made to make it run better.

Wild means living or growing in nature without the help of people.

wildness¹⁷

Wildness is the quality of being wild, not tamed, or not settled down.

A cue is a signal. *The actor waited for his cue from the director before going on stage.*

flatten²⁷

Flatten means to press something flat, or to make something thinner. *I will flatten the pie crust with a rolling pin.*

A hue is a shade of color. *A* tree in the fall can have a red hue.



instrument

An instrument is something that is used to make music. *A drum is a loud instrument.*

loyal²²

Loyal means faithful to or willing to stay with someone or something. *My dog is loyal; he follows me everywhere and sleeps on my bed at night.*

master²³

A master is a person in control of other people or animals.

movements

Movements are the acts of moving or changing positions. *We could see how hard the wind was blowing from the flapping movements of the flag.*

pursue

When you pursue something, you follow it or chase it. *A fox will pursue its prey*.

rattle²⁸

Rattle means to make many quick tapping or knocking sounds. *If you shake a lot of pebbles together, you will hear them rattle as they knock against each other.*

ruse²⁹

A ruse is a trick or plan for fooling someone.

sway

Sway means to move back and forth slowly. *The tree's leaves sway in the wind.*

unique²

neck²⁶

A neck is a narrow section of something. *The neck of a guitar is the part that is long and narrow.*

scale²⁴

A scale is a set of musical sounds that are arranged in order from low to high or high to low. *There are eight notes in a scale*.

seldom

Seldom means not very often. *Because four-leaf clovers are very rare, people seldom find them.*

tube²³

Stripes are long, thin lines that are different in color or shade from the color touching them.

If something lies somewhere, it is in that place. A giant stone lies in the corner of our yard.

opposites ¹⁴

Opposites are things that are as different from one another as possible. *Hot and cold are opposites, and good and evil are opposites.*

springs

Springs are streams of water that flow from under the ground and are often the sources of larger bodies of water.

volcanoes

Volcanoes are openings in the earth that shoot out lava, ash, and steam; the hills around these openings, made by the cooled, hardened lava, are also called volcanoes. *Lava shoots from some volcanoes, but other volcanoes no longer shoot out lava and steam.*

based on³

Based on means created from something that happened or from something that already existed. *I want to see the new movie; it is based on one of my favorite old books.*

coast²⁵

The coast is the place where an ocean touches land.



crude²⁶

Crude means rough, simple, or basic. *When* Andre was stuck in the woods, he made a crude bed out of pine needles.

gathered²⁸

Gathered means brought together in one place. *Ivie gathered her hair behind her head with a barrette.*

greet³²

Greet means to welcome or to say hello or other friendly words when you meet someone. *Many people shake hands when they greet each other*.

island²⁴

An island is land surrounded on all sides by a body of water.



mainland³¹

The mainland is a large piece of land that makes up most of a country or continent. Islands are not part of the mainland. *Hawaii is part of the United States, but it is not on the mainland where the rest of the states are.*

plumes

Plumes are the large, fluffy feathers on some birds.



rescue³³

A rescue is the act of bringing someone to safety. *The lifeguard came to the boy's rescue when she saved him from drowning.*

wild³⁰

Wild means not trained to live with people. *People should not keep wild animals, like lions, as pets.*

wove

Wove means made something like a cloth or a basket by crossing threads or strips over and under each other. *I wove a basket*.
