
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Mammals

Animals are things that are living and are not plants.






born alive¹⁵

warm-blooded¹³



A son is a child of a mother or father. A son can be a boy or a man.




sound

cars


Cars are the large parts of a train that have space for people or things.

Plants that do not need much water live in deserts.




run
