### Let's play...

# BEGINNING/MIDDLE/ENDING SOUND GAME

### What do I need?

Print and cut out the following sets of cards:

- Lower-Case Letter Cards
- Animal Picture Cards

# How do I play? This example uses the beginning sound. This game can also be played with middle and ending sounds.

- 1. Gather into a small group with your students.
- 2. Pass out the animal picture cards equally to each student. You keep the letter cards.
- 3. Ask each student to look at their cards and determine what the *beginning* sounds of the names of their animals are.
- 4. Ask if any students need help identifying the sounds.
- 5. Once students are ready to play, lay down a letter card. Depending on the skill level of the students, you can decide whether to say the letter's name and sound.
- 6. The student who has a picture card that *begins* with that sound lays their card down.
- 7. The student who runs out of cards first is the winner.

This game can be played using beginning, middle, or ending sounds. Some combinations include:
